

SIGNING AN A-CARD MAY LOCK YOU INTO THE MACHINIST'S WORLD



The Machinists say that signing an authorization card is *“like adding your signature to that guy’s clipboard outside Whole Foods.”* **It’s not.** It’s a serious decision that could change your career and relationship with Delta, perhaps forever.

A SIGNED A-CARD:

- May **trigger an election** that could result in the Machinists becoming the representative for all Delta flight attendants – **even if less than a majority of all flight attendants vote for the IAM.** How? Employees that do not vote are not counted as “against” representation – they are simply not counted. And write-in votes for another union could be counted in favor of the IAM.
- Gives the Machinists your **personal information**, including your address, phone number and email. The IAM has no obligation to keep that information confidential.
- **Belongs to the IAM** and is good for one year. If you change your mind, they have no obligation to give the card back to you.
